The two silhouettes are in a relation that can be compared to Freud's 'Ich and Uber-Ich'. These photographical images are different interpretations of the world where any random person could transfer himself or herself in. The viewer can see himself in this world and attribute his feelings to this image.

Astrid has been part of the organization 'OverdeKunst' since 2013, and has been a member of the artist collective 'Stichting Ateliers Apeldoorn'.
